Notes of a meeting held on Tuesday 21st February 2023 at 7pm in Coldingham Village Hall

Previous minutes : notes of January meeting approved by R Thomas and seconded by N Wood.

Matters Arising : Roadworks been carried out in various places, will have to wait for rain again to gauge effectiveness. Highways dept have been out and put a camera down culvert on A1107, confirming that the culvert has indeed collapsed. No date for work as yet.

Treasurer's report : NW reported that £500 been received from Berwickshire Civic Society towards the Cross. RES have all information requested, so we can be optimistic re the remaining funding. Work due to commence April.

Police Report – No report available. Discussion took place around recent vehicle theft in village.

SBC Cllrs Reports – There is a project ongoing to start putting up gravestones laid flat. No date. Signs for the beach – Denise Brydon has arranged for better signage re dogs on the beach. Another year of funding has been granted for PINGO bus. Please keep using it so it is not lost. There is a fund offering CCs £500 to do something commemorating the King's coronation, please think and let RG know of ideas. Scrutiny & Petitions Cttee of SBC requesting things they need to be looking at – immediate thoughts are roads, again let RG know of ideas.

AOCB : ET summarised her contact with the previous provider of defib training. It looks as though he would be happy to do it again, but at present, due to all sorts of reasons, he and other first responders are seriously busy answering emergency calls. Suggestion was made to use a community nurse, BAVS or a Northumberland organisation. We'll keep this rolling for the present as there is no immediate urgency. Reported flooding in the area around the sewerage works just beyond Scoutscroft, question asked if current works will affect this. The wall down from Dunscoft on Fishers' Brae is damaged, could someone from SBC inspect this? Discussion took place on cost of living support available for those requiring it. Law Farm is still an active building site, officers are aware. Cllr Anderson suggested a source of signage for areas with rubbish issues.
