Applicant	Awarded Amount	Purpose
Berwickshire Marine Reserve (Community Engagement Worker)	£3,500	To fund extension of a Community Engagement Officer post for twelve months beyond October 2022, thereby mainstreaming a pilot lobster hatchery and schools programme.
Sea the Change (Project Co-ordinator)	£4,425	To contribute towards the employment costs of expanding the Project Co-ordinator post, thereby sustaining and enhancing Sea The Change's environmental awareness raising, John Muir Award scheme and other community activities in East Berwickshire.
Cash for Kids (Radio Borders) - Berwickshire	£9,500	To continue the holiday support programme in the Drone Hill Fund area, providing vouchers for food, equipment, basic essentials and warm winter clothing for disadvantaged children.
Ayton Heritage (St Dionysius ruin preservation)	£3,500	To contribute to the costs of initial steps to preserve the historically significant St Dionysius (Ayton parish church) old kirk ruin.
Eyemouth Scout Group (minibus back into use)	£1,500	To contribute to the costs of bringing the Eyemouth Scout group's minibus back into use for a range of trips and activities, thereby generating a range of health and well-being benefits amongst local young people.
Re-Tweed (International Tartans)	£10,000	To contribute towards staff, training, childcare and subsistence costs establishing 'International Tartans' as a social enterprise offering employability opportunities for disadvantaged women in Berwickshire
The Friends of Coldingham Priory (Priory garden improvements)	£3,000	To fund gate refurbishment, tree-planting and an information booklet to enhance Coldingham Priory as a visually appealing, educational and leisure amenity
Berwickshire Swap (rental costs)	£6,660	To contribute to the rental costs of the Berwickshire Swap premises in Duns, from where a range of clothing, toy and household recycling and redistribution activities can take place, benefiting disadvantaged families in surrounding communities
Eyemouth High School Parent Council (Horticulture garden)	£2,113	To fund new equipment and resources for the Eyemouth School allotment and enhance its use by pupils and local volunteers, thereby improving health, wellbeing, environmental awareness and social connections.
